



Survivors of Abuse PA Expands Daycare Sexual Abuse Lawyer Resource

PHILADELPHIA, PA - August 18, 2026 -

Survivors of Abuse PA announced on August 17, 2026, that it has expanded its online information concerning daycare sexual abuse civil claims, with material addressing cases involving childcare facilities in Pennsylvania. The Philadelphia-based organization said the resource is intended to provide factual information about civil procedures, potential institutional responsibility, and issues that can arise when alleged abuse occurs in a daycare or childcare setting.

"The firm created this resource to organize information about civil claims involving daycare settings and to explain how institutional responsibility may be evaluated under Pennsylvania law," said Ashley DiLiberto, Esq., founder of Survivors of Abuse PA. The publication forms part of the organization's broader collection of information concerning civil sexual abuse litigation.

Daycare sexual abuse claims can involve conduct attributed to an individual as well as questions concerning the actions of a childcare facility or other organization. The daycare abuse resource addresses circumstances

involving daycares, preschools, childcare centers, in-home care providers, after-school programs, and early-learning facilities.

Civil proceedings differ from criminal investigations and prosecutions. A civil case generally examines potential legal responsibility and available civil remedies, while a criminal case concerns alleged violations prosecuted by government authorities. The existence, status, or outcome of one proceeding does not necessarily determine every issue that may arise in the other.

Cases involving childcare organizations may require examination of institutional records and the circumstances surrounding the alleged conduct. Depending on the facts, relevant materials may include employment information, supervision practices, incident documentation, prior complaints, internal communications, reporting records, medical records, witness information, and records maintained by public agencies.

Institutional responsibility is evaluated according to the facts and applicable law in each matter. Allegations involving a childcare facility can raise questions about hiring, employee supervision, reporting procedures, responses to prior concerns, and actions taken after an incident was reported. The presence of an allegation does not by itself establish civil liability, and each claim requires an individual factual and legal assessment.

Pennsylvania also has laws governing the timing of civil claims arising from childhood sexual abuse. Filing deadlines can depend on factors including the survivor's age, the date of the alleged conduct, and the legal provisions applicable to the particular circumstances. The Survivors of Abuse PA website includes information concerning sexual abuse civil litigation and the types of institutional settings that may be involved.

The organization's daycare materials also distinguish civil claims from child-protection reporting procedures. Situations involving immediate danger or suspected child abuse may involve law enforcement, medical professionals, child-protection authorities, or other government agencies independently of any later civil proceeding. Civil attorneys evaluate separate questions concerning whether a claim may be filed and which individuals or entities may be named in litigation.

Survivors of Abuse PA was founded by Ashley B. DiLiberto, Esq., and operates in collaboration with Messa & Associates, P.C. DiLiberto is licensed to practice law in Pennsylvania and other jurisdictions and works on civil matters involving allegations of sexual abuse and institutional responsibility. The organization publishes materials addressing abuse allegations in settings including childcare facilities, schools, religious organizations, medical facilities, residential programs, and other institutions.

The organization's Philadelphia daycare materials address legal issues that can arise when alleged misconduct occurs while a child is under the supervision of a childcare provider. The information discusses

the potential roles of individual actors and institutions without treating allegations as established findings and notes that the circumstances of each matter determine the legal analysis.

The expanded information also addresses evidence that may be reviewed during the evaluation of a potential civil matter. Records concerning facility operations, employee conduct, reporting activity, communications, medical care, and investigative findings can become relevant depending on the allegations and the parties involved. No single category of evidence determines the outcome of every daycare abuse claim.

Survivors of Abuse PA states that its legal work includes civil sexual abuse matters throughout Pennsylvania, while its office is based in Philadelphia.
